STUDENT NEWS

'KARATE KID' BLACK BELT GRADING

Congratulations to Year 9 student George E who has achieved the Shodan grading (first black belt) on 6th December 2024.

George has been training in Shotokan Karate since he was eight with Porchester Karate Club - a well established club which was founded in 1982 by Sensei Merv O'Donnell 8th Dan. Sensei Merv, who started training in 1967, was trained by the students of Funakoshi Gichin, the creator of Shotokan Karate.

To pass his grading, George had to demonstrate Kihon (basics), Kata (choreographed form), Kumite (fighting), and Bunkai (application of Kata in self defence). He had to maintain technique and spirit for the duration



of the grading, as well as demonstrating continual improvement and continued commitment, over the the last six months when he was first selected to grade.

After being awarded his 1st Dan, George had to do his next lesson in his old brown belt, before the official presentation of the black belt. This is a club tradition known as the 'humility lesson' which teaches the students that the success is not in achieving the belt itself, but in how they conduct themselves.

In Shotokan Karate, a student must wait the duration of their next grade before they can be considered ready to try for that grade. George's next grade will be Nidan (2nd Dan), which means he will not be able to grade again for at least two years. So the journey starts here... Well done George!

CYCLOCROSS

Elite Sports Programme sisters Eva (Year 9) and Isabelle M-M (Year 7) have been doing tremendously well with their cycling and have been chosen to represent their cycling club in Belgium this weekend in two cyclo-cross events.

Both girls have had success this season at a Regional and National Level. Eva is currently ranked 7th nationally and was chosen to represent the South Team at a two day inter-regional cyclocross event before Christmas and her team won. They are now inter-regional champions for cyclocross!

Racing this weekend in Belgium will be an incredible experience for both girls and we wish them luck.

IN CONVERSATION WITH... DAVID HAREWOOD

Actor, author and activist David Harewood will be at the MAST Mayflower Studios on 28th January.

Exploring the impact of being Black in Britain, this discussion will examine what it means to struggle, suffer, survive, and succeed, focusing on David Harewood's work in acting, writing, and production.

Key questions will be addressed, including: to what extent do language and cultural differences shape conversations around race and mental health?

Themes of masculinity, colourism, and identity will be explored, including the experience of growing up as a black boy and the lasting impact on black men into adulthood.

The conversation aims to unpack the conflicting opinions surrounding racial identity in Britain and examine how open discussions can encourage a deeper understanding of these complex notions.

This will be followed by a conversation with Pascal Matthias, Vice President of Equality, Diversity, Inclusion and Social Justice at University of Southampton and audience Q&A. This event is part of Pascal Matthias' Conflict, Communication and Compassion Conversations series of conversations with leading voices.
