YEAR 10 AND 11 NEWS

GCSE SCIENCE LIVE!

Yesterday a number of our Year 10 and Year 11 science students went to New Theatre Oxford for the GCSE Science Live roadshow.

There were many emminent speakers presenting on a number of interesting and varied subjects.

There were cool experiments and demonstrations from Dr Eleonora D'Elia and Prof Andrea Sella taking inspiration from nature and applying and explaining it to/using materials science. Dr D'Elia spoke about how the nanostructure of a kingfisher causes its iridescence and how that knowledge has been used to make iridescent plastic and also how the nanostructure of a gecko's foot has helped develop scotch tape. Dr Sella told us how the study of equilibrium reactions explains stripes found in nature e.g. a zebras skin pattern and that each zebra is unique.

There was also a fascinating time travel talk from Prof Jim Al-Khalili, a thought provoking talk about the future of computing from Prof Dave Cliff.

The students particularly enjoyed the time travelling talk and Mr Lloyd the experiments and demonstrations from Dr D'Elia and Prof Sella!
